

SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS WITH FEWER OPPORTUNITIES – INCREASE BY UNIT CONTRIBUTION

The financial support is €250 per month for long-term mobility. In the case of short-term mobilities, this is a one-off increase of €150 for stays of 15 days or more. For shorter stays of up to 14 days, there is a one-off increase of €100.

The increase is assessed in all cases in accordance with Act No.117/1995 Coll., on State Social Support, as amended, which specifies the coefficient for confirming entitlement to child benefit. This coefficient is also applicable in the case of the assessment of the increase for Erasmus+ mobility. Currently (as of 1 January 2024), the coefficient is 3,4 times the minimum subsistence level for the household concerned.

The increase is assessed and granted before the start of the student's mobility.

- Student with an economic barrier
 - a student can apply up to and including 26 years of age; the decisive age is assessed before the start of the mobility)
 - all documentation proving eligibility must be valid at the start date of mobility
 - certificates proving entitlement to the financial increase:
 - a) student's parents receive child allowance for the student:
 - a certificate of child benefit in accordance with Act No. 117/1995 Coll., on State Social Support, as amended, shall be presented for the last completed quarter; such certificate shall be valid for the entire mobility period for Erasmus+ mobility
 - b) the student is already receiving a social grant at his/her home university:
 - decision on the award of a social scholarship
 - c) the student is already receiving another special scholarship awarded by the university due to economic disadvantage:
 - decision on the award of a special scholarship
 - e.g., the student, because of his/her situation, is already receiving an exceptional scholarship awarded by the dean or other person authorised to award an exceptional scholarship because of a difficult financial situation
 - d) student is enrolled in a foreign system that demonstrates a low socio-economic background
 - e) student receives social support in his or her country of origin:
 - certificate of entitlement to state benefits in the country of origin, translated into English or Czech
 - f) student who has both parents in a foreign country (his/her country of origin) and can prove low household income:
 - certificate of household income that does not exceed 3,4 times the minimum subsistence level in the Czech Republic
 - the amount of the subsistence minimum is calculated from the household where the student has a permanent residence
 - the certificate is further supplemented by a sworn declaration that the student has no income other than that documented
- Student with children

- unlimited age
- it is necessary to present the birth certificate and at the same time:
 - a) current certificate of household income not exceeding 3,4 times the minimum subsistence level
 - b) or a child benefit certificate (in this case, the student must present this document for the last completed calendar quarter or the period of mobility)
- the certificate is further supplemented by a sworn declaration that the student has no income other than that documented
- Student receiving orphan's pension
 - a student can apply up to and including 26 years of age; the decisive age is assessed before the start of the mobility)
 - a certificate of receiving an orphan's pension and a household income that does not exceed 3,4 times the minimum subsistence level
 - the amount of the subsistence minimum is calculated from the household where the student has a permanent residence
 - the certificate is further supplemented by a sworn declaration that the student has no income other than that documented
- Students with special dietary needs
 - unlimited age
 - a current medical certificate justifying the claimed expenses related to the special dietary needs
 - costs cannot be duplicated when combined with inclusion support
